shops to run for the Browns.

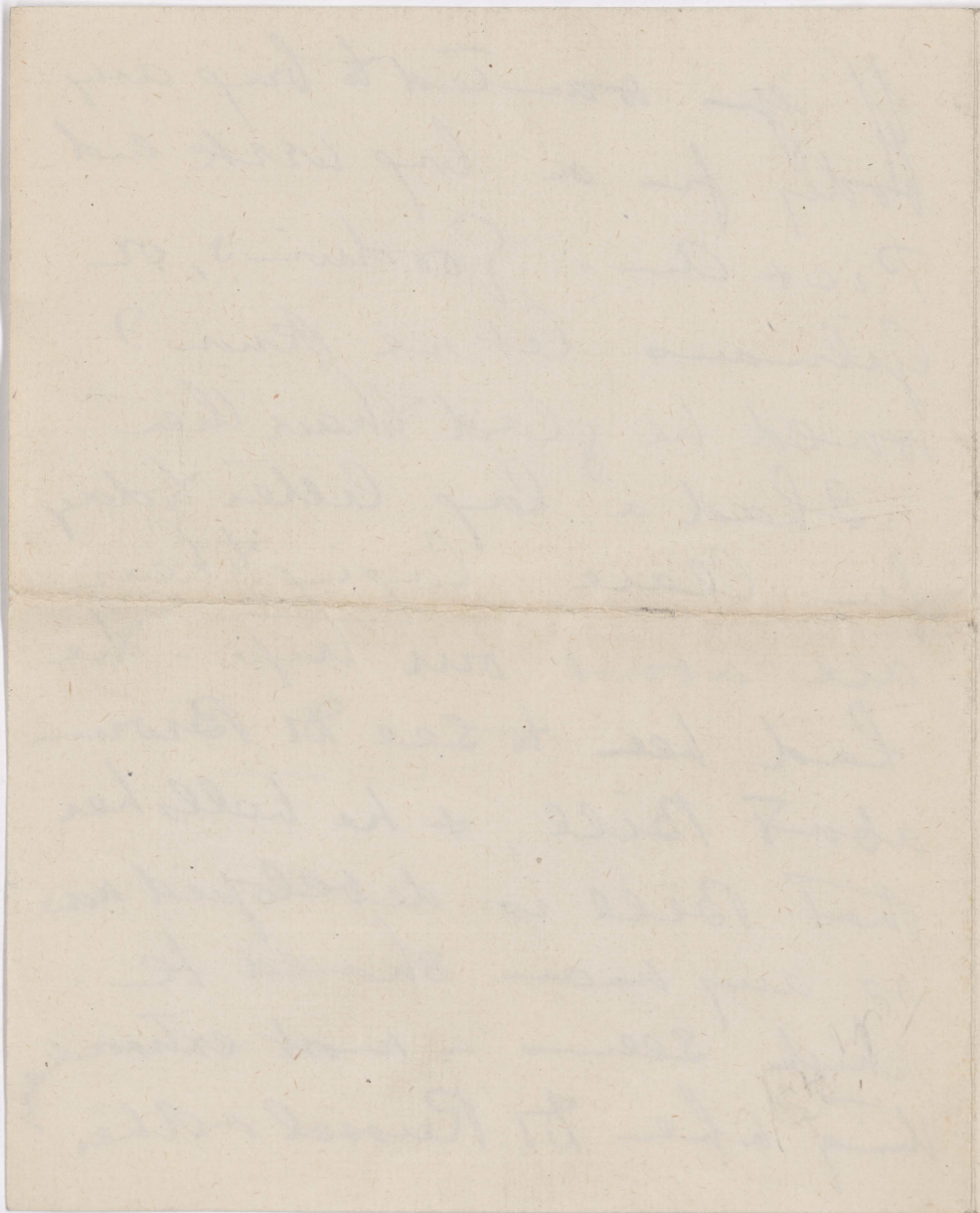
