In spite of that I hope you enjoyed your visit and that the change will be good for you.

I thought both Frances and Fotty did excellent jobs without appearing to be at all busy or concerned.

Sorry our little Anne did not have a dance but it could not be helped.

This evening Isabel telephoned from the Trumpers home in Kingston and Frances has gone to bed radiantly happy.

She had a long talk with me in my room at about 4³⁰ o'clock

You will notice that a famous violinist is going to be the soloist at a concert in the St Denis or one of the concert Halls on Friday Evening the 16th. It will be a day late for your Birthday but if you would enjoy it or if you and Alice would enjoy it I would meet you for dinner at the University Club at say 7 o'clock. You would get 3 good seats, presumably at one of Hymans Tobacco stores or Lindsay Music store and I would be glad to
