My dear Seelye

at last I see my way clear I shall repeat to leave here next Maçon read Geneva at 11 a.m. on Saturday. I will telegraph you as soon as I arrive. I will go from Geneva to Chamouin if possible to return via Col de Balme on the tele noise to Marigny. Then we can return to Levey up to the Oberland for a few days. I would propose to send my baggage from Geneva to Vevey by my pension, where I hope to spend a few days before my return. I shall hope to get an answer from you by post or telegraph in Geneva. If you can come spend Sunday with me there. we shall meet some of the Larants - Yane others. If you cannot come I may spend Sunday with you. but I should like to go to Chamouin Monday morning.
