My dear Sir

Many thanks for your note
 of this date. I have a table, signed
 by Bro. Kelly Depy Commr. and
 under the seal of the Province of
 N.S., shewing the quantity of
 "quartz crushed + amount of
 "gold obtained from the German
 "mines on the Inver & North
 "Dorset, Waverly District, Co. of
 "Halifax; - viz 17,655 tons or cub
 "of quartz which yielded 15,698.03.
 "15 dwts + 18 grs. & this with very
 "rude & wasteful appliances.

This mine is spoken of in
 Dr Hunt's Report on the Gold
 Region of Nova Scotia page 26

You will observe that the smaller table gives
 the returns up to last month.
