I think is from the Coniferales.
It has some peculiar features
the upper surface shows raised

was a ridge and the small
is which come to the surface
sharp angle seem to start from
each side of these one ascending
ridges. a Vertical section shows
that it is not a solid mass but
runs in loose joints meeting at
certain points and then separating
I can see nothing like a perfect lamination
I send a little pencil sketch which
of course is very imperfect. If you
see any new points about it and
would like to see the specimens
I have, I will forward them to you
for examination. Could you
send me the names of the specimen
from Marble Head and the one
I sent you from Maldece
having the dark and light wavy
bands. I am afraid I put you
to a good deal of trouble but
I am much interested in these
forms
