Both of the Bills introduced by Mr. Lynch, in reference to the Professions and Professional Examinations, were lost in Committee, but an effort is to be made to reintroduce both of them in connection with other Bills. Mr. Trenholme of Montreal was here yesterday, and had an interview with the Premier about these matters, and the Premier, I believe, has promised to give his strongest support to the measures in the form in which they are to be reintroduced. The points to be asked for are first; That the B.A be accepted, and second; That the relation of the Law Faculties to the General Council and to the Lieutenant Governor in Council previous to 1886, be re-established.
