My dear Mother,

Under the impression
that you may possibly like to have
a note though containing no
news, I write this. We are
getting along satisfactorily enough,
hope to reach St-Paul in
a few hours, & after about two
hours delay there - if the
train is on time - take
the Northern Pacific & begin
going west. I have not yet
worked out the date of probable

arrival in Victoria, but it
 will be I suppose in four or
 five days from this. Weather
 very pleasant for travelling &
 by no means too warm.
 Recent heavy rains have laid the
 dust. I hope you may
 have returned or will soon
 recover from Topley, in
 Ottawa, the photos. I had
 taken at your request. I
 think I wrote about them
 before I left. You might
 send a couple by mail
 to my address Victoria B.C.

By the way, I suppose
 Victoria will be my best address
 for the summer. I will make
 arrangements to have letters
 sent on from time to time to
 other points, some time when
 Fulton is in town he might
 subscribe for the weekly
 Gazette & Herald - I think
 I will give up the witnesses -
 to be sent also to Victoria.
 4 months subscription or 6 months
 if they will not take less, will
 be ample. Perhaps it would
 be better to subscribe for the
 daily form of papers for 4 months.
