I have just received  
your telegram & as my  
sick one is sleeping I  
will send you a few lines  
She has been ill a week  
now, intermittent fever,  
verruis on typhoid, brought  
on the doctors say from  
vilitated air - the meeting  
on that evening, <sup>Sunday</sup> was very  
hot, very crowded, & she  
who took it, felt it

very much, it was not  
till Wed! however that  
she saw the doctor, who  
thought seriously of the  
case. She went on getting  
worse, on Friday she had  
further advice & on  
Saturday I telegraphed  
to Dean Grassle to send  
me a Physician - This he  
did by post train - Dr. Stray  
he was with her several  
times Sat Night & Sunday  
Morng - giving a most  
unsatisfactory report  
considering her life in  
the greatest danger. last

Night was quiet & altho still  
in danger I cannot but  
believe she is going to be  
given back in answer to  
the innumerable prayers  
which have gone up for  
her. The feeling here is  
wonderful. 4 prayers  
meetings were held yesterday  
for her, she was mention-  
-ed in church & every  
chapel & in fact all over  
Canada - Major Melan  
is here which is a great  
comfort as he has been  
able to carry on the work,  
he remains till Friday  
I believe - Many thanks

for offers of help but we  
are better alone, as she  
must be kept so perfectly  
quiet. I do not allow even  
to knock at the door  
she is learning every thing  
done that is possible &  
the best we leave in the Lord's  
hands. Milk is almost  
the only thing she has  
taken. Please tell Mr. Proctor  
& any other my own friends  
as I cannot be writing  
letters. With remembrance

to 102. I have a faithful  
servant to help me in mending  
& offers of help on every hand.
