My Dear Anna

This little note
will have to serve as an
apology for my weekly letter
this time. I am just now
on a little tour & will not
I fear get back to Edinburgh
in time for the Canadian
mail. My route has been
from Edinburgh to Glasgow.
Ballach, Loch Lomond, Loch
Katherine, Trossachs, Callender,
& now I am at Stirling on

my way back to Edinburgh
again. When I say I
started from Edinburgh I
am not strictly right for
it was from Aunt Primrose's
at Musselburgh that my
departure was taken I
had meant to leave
on Monday morning &
had packed up everything
in readiness, but the
weather seemed so very
uncertain & threatening
that I reluctantly put it
off. As soon however as

it had become too late for
the train It cleared up &
became quite fine. I
then determined to leave
by the next train at
12 o'clock, but then again
just before time to go it
came on a most tremendous
storm of rain, wind, &
hail. Again it was put
off & this time finally
for the day, & again it
cleared up beautifully
in the afternoon.

My intention in staying here
(at Sluzbing) all night is to

see what is to be seen
tomorrow & then go into Edinburgh
by an afternoon train. It
is possible to do the whole tour
in a day, but I preferred
spending two nights on the way
as this enables one to see a
little of ~~the~~ various places, &
also to make a few sketches, though
In reality I have made precious
few. I have not yet seen any
telegram of the arrival of the
Nestorian, but as the telegram
of the arrival of the Prussian (Papua
steamer) did not appear in the
Scottish papers; I hope that ere I
write this Mamma ~~is~~ is safe
with you again. From the
unsettled weather, here, however
I fear her passage has been rough.
With much love to yourself Mamma
