I have one Machine of Bulmer & Shepperson Manufacture of Montreal which burns out ten thousand per day, driven by two horses and attended by six men and two boys at an average cost per day of \$8.50 the cost per thousand has fell from \$12.00 in 1875. to \$6.00 in 1877

I have supplied the western extension of the Parliament Buildings with 500,000 also the sewer at Ottawa with a quantity also. I have also first class material

for the Manufacture of pottery under
meash the britn clay of a dark blue
color. which I may send a few
pounds of at some other time
