Dear Sir:-

I have a matter of business that I would like to put before Sir William Dawson; but in his present state of health I am not sure that he ought to have business put before him. I have therefore taken the liberty of addressing you on the subject, and you can put it before him or not as you think proper.

The last of his books that I published "The Ice Age" did not sell as well as was expected, and I have now about four hundred (400) copies on hand, mostly in sheets.
