coming here to see his Papa
and is just going to sermon for
a visit and go back to his
Grandfather and be a Farmer.

the Spring coming again with all
the beautiful Showers. I have not
been out to the Gardens since last
Fall but intend going out some
of these days to see the early Showers
and so Baby is beginning to
speak he will be a great deal of
company for you all and if
I could I would like very much to
see him. is it not too
bad that there is so much land

and Water. Between us who used
all to live in one House long ago
but. we must hope all these things
are well ordered. I was not yesterday
at Mr. Gapes they have five little
boys and one little girl among
them at all they are dear little fellows
and have a fine time running
in the Green Fields the Gap is
getting quite Green and pretty in some
parts. I suppose you have almost
forgotten about Pictou and all
the little boys and girls but I
dare say you have nice little playmates
in Montreal. there is a great deal
of talk here about the Prince of
Wales coming Here I hope there
will be a good time to all
and that all may have health
and comfort to enjoy the sights
there to be seen. The Canada
Steamers come Here regularly and
have a very fine appearance but
it was very sad to think of
the fate of the ill fated Ungowic

and of the many usefull Lives
lost in a Moment it should
make us thankfull that we have
not shared such a fate but have
been preserved in all our Landings
without and are in such agreeable
circumstances. there has been a
great deal of Small Pox here and
a number of Persons have died
but it is now over I hope for the
present. I heard of the case of a poor
Man who had taken it who had no
Home He went into a Beer shop
far from the Shipyard and was then
taken to the Hospital but died in
a day or two there and was buried as though
he had not a friend in the world

And now Dear George I would
close this Letter by Hoping that when
you get time you will send me a few
Lines sometimes. Give my Love to Ann
and Willie. I Hope if you and papa take
a Voyage this Summer you may have a pleasant
time and your Health may be restored.
Mr Stewart also gives me in kind regards
to you all and himself in particular
