Archie Malloch is here, just fininshing the proofs of his study on Finch & Baines these two 17th century friends. He is still at the McGill Hospital. Bill F. was here a few weeks ago He has done splendid work. Norman is laid up with a Para -A., quite a sharp infection, malaunia &c. but he is now better. . .
