I don't know who Lady Mary Murray's friends are to whom she wrote - but she belongs to a General Committee here for Refugees and they are having a ___: __ time with peasants - Socialists & Ladies of a very Tra-la-la nature. Our Professors are very plucky & trying to work. White foly blue Man. at The wives & children are nervous & much upset - It requires much tact to find out their wants as they are proud and sensitive - Mrs. Max Müller & I do the work and W.O. smiles & signs the checks - I believe we will have them for months - They haven't a penny - those who had a few francs have gone thro it so we shall need every penny we have got. Clothes alone for 100 people are an item. Life is very tragic at present. And one can hardly take it in - I saw 29 huge Transports just now in front of St. Johns College ready for an East Coast invasion - to motor troops across country. That seems a fear at present. We have a Base Hospital here with 1000 beds - And it all keeps one busy. Nearly all the large private houses in London are full of wounded. Our love to you.
