Marion & Jean will come here I think to meet her. I wish I had never mentioned Susan coming as I fear it will upset you - but dont think of it again. We are expecting Revere for two days which will be a comfort. We are having at last two glorious days and every one is rejoicing. Things will bloom now - The roses have been ruined by the soggy dampness - Fortunately I dont have to go to Liverpool with Joan - Fiskin has appeared and will go with her. Harold Wrong is missing, which is another sad thing and several other Oxford men we know - I have just been seeing an Irish doctor in Somerville who has 25 shrapnel wounds with one eye gone -Much love -Affly Grace.
