CUS417/99.69 In your case of alcaptonuria I wish you would look at the inside of the ears to see if he has pigmentation of his cartilages. Both of our Baltimore cases have that remarkable condition of ocronosis described by Virchow years ago, of which there are only some seven cases in the literature. Garrod is very much interested in the fact, and it is quite possible that a majority of the ocronosis cases are associated with alcaptonuria.

I see your paper referred to several times in a new study of the condition in the Deutsches Arch. f. klin. Med., October 15th, 1903. Sincerely yours,
