(May 9, 1913)

My dear Mrs. Chief

In 1905 when I was in Oxford the Chief and I planted some seeds which have yielded fruit; just how much this has been is hard to estimate - That many hungry souls have been fed by this fruit is attested to by the letters of expressions I get every year - Besides this soul feeding success the planting has yielded practical returns. I have waited till these took on some proportions & while these are yet modest I want you & the Chief to have them. If you know of some book he wants and something you would like to get for yourself with this little figure will you please be the middleman and turn the trick.

As usual the Chief managed to attend to every thing & see everybody during this short stay - My wife was greatly cheered by his visits to her - My *wife* is now among the "shut-ins" but like so many of them she has a place & thought for others which makes an atmosphere peculiar in its influence upon the busy out worker -

I hear good reports of Revere - If you bring him to Murray Bay we will show him some wood life - I hope the Murray Bay plan will work out & that we will have you all for a stay here
