Dear Blackader

I saw your boy today. I had not heard that he had come over until I had a telephone from Armour asking me to come up today. The mouth wound has healed almost, he is still anaemic from the loss of blood, but the complication of importance is a pleuro-pneumonia at the left base, with an aggravating cough. They are to put in a needle as the whole business may be a septic pleurisy. The general condition is good and he will do well. He is most comfortable at the new Hospital. I sent you a wire to reassure you. I will keep you posted. Love to Mrs. Blackader /
