In reply to your card to hand this morning, the Mockler collection of Jenner relics is in this Museum.

With reference to the address you mention that was forwarded to Jenner by the Red Indians of North American, you will find details on page 87 of my little book on the "History of Inoculation and Vaccination" which was published by Burroughs Wellcome & Co. in 1913. I will copy it out for you if you have not a copy at hand.

Accompanying this address was a gift of a belt and a string of wampum from the Indians to Jenner, but I have never been able to trace what became of it. It was not among the relics collected by Mockler, nor did Jenner's relatives know what became of it. It is probably in existence somewhere, and it is possible that the owner is ignorant of its origin.
