

Before one of the subscribing Public Notary, residing in the District of Montreal in the Province of Canada, and the Witnesses hereafter mentioned.

Personally appeared and was present Mistress Elizabeth Clapperton, wife of Mr Andrew Fishman, residing in the Parish of Lachine in the said District of Montreal Farmer. Who being in perfect health of sound mind, memory and understanding as appeared to the said Notary and Witnesses & being mindful of her Mortality and the uncertain time thereof, hath made, dictated & published to the said Notary in presence of the said Witnesses, her last Will and Testament in the Manner following.

1st I do hereby resign her soul in to the hand of Almighty God, hoping and becoming a remission of her sins through the merits & mediation of Jesus Christ & desire to be decently & privately buried in the Church yard belonging to the Protestant Church of the said Parish of Lachine, with the funeral pomp according to her means.

Secondly She gave and bequeath unto
M^r John Lishman her son the whole of
her property, moveables or immoveables and
effects belonging to her at the day and
hour of her death, at the charges, Clauses
and Conditions following. Viz: On by the
said John Lishman her said son, paying
to Mary, Elizabeth, Margt, William, Janet,
Helen, Agnes, Amelia, & Angelina Martha
Lishman his Sisters & Brother, Childrens of
the said Mistress Elizabeth Clapperton with
the said M^r Andrew Lishman her husband
the sum of fifty pounds Currency of these
Province to each of them, beginning by
the Older at their age of Majority, beginning
to pay the above sum, to each of them
without interest, in two years distance from
one another and beginning two years after
the death of the said Testatrix, and if any
of the above named Children would happen
to die before that the above mentioned sum
be paid to them, the said John Lishman
be obliged to pay for their funeral and the
mourning of those that be single unmarried
which

which said sum be extinguished in favour of
the heirs of the dying, and it is the Will
and Desire of the said Testator that the
said Mr. Andrew Fishman her said
husband, have the full enjoyment of
the whole of her property during his
life ~~life~~ time, providing that the revenue
and profit after the necessary takings
out of it for food & Clothing be employed
for paying the above sums the said
enjoyment will take place providing
that the said Mr. Andrew Fishman
her said husband will not revoke nor
annul the last Will or Testament signed
these day, in favour of the said John
Fishman. And also at the charge
by the said John Fishman to keep
with him his said sisters, and to procure
and provide for them the necessary board
Clothing, and Comforts according their
Stations in life until their respective
marriage, and to keep them in school
according their means, and at the marriage
to each of them, be the said John
Fishman

Leishman be bound and obliged to
give to each of them one Chest of Drawers
one bed & bedstead & one Cow of good Condition
And it is the will and desire of the
said Testatrix that if any sum or sums
of Money or articles above mentioned
be paid at the marriage of any of them
or during the life of the said Testatrix
that he the said John Leishman be
discharged of so much as paid. —

And the said Testatrix Constitutes
and appoints and Names Mr Thomas
Daws & Mr William Howarth both
residing in the said Parish of Sackville
farmers, praying them to be her Executors
Testamentary.

These presents Will has been
thus done & dictated by the said
Testatrix to the said Notary in presence
of Mr Joseph Saffman, Inn Keeper
& Mr John Kerr, Black Smith
both residing in the Parish of Sackville
in the residence of the said Testatrix
in the said Parish of Sackville these

eight day, of October in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and
forty two in the forenoon and the
said Testatrix and witnesses have signed
with me said Notary after reading the
second reading according to Law.—

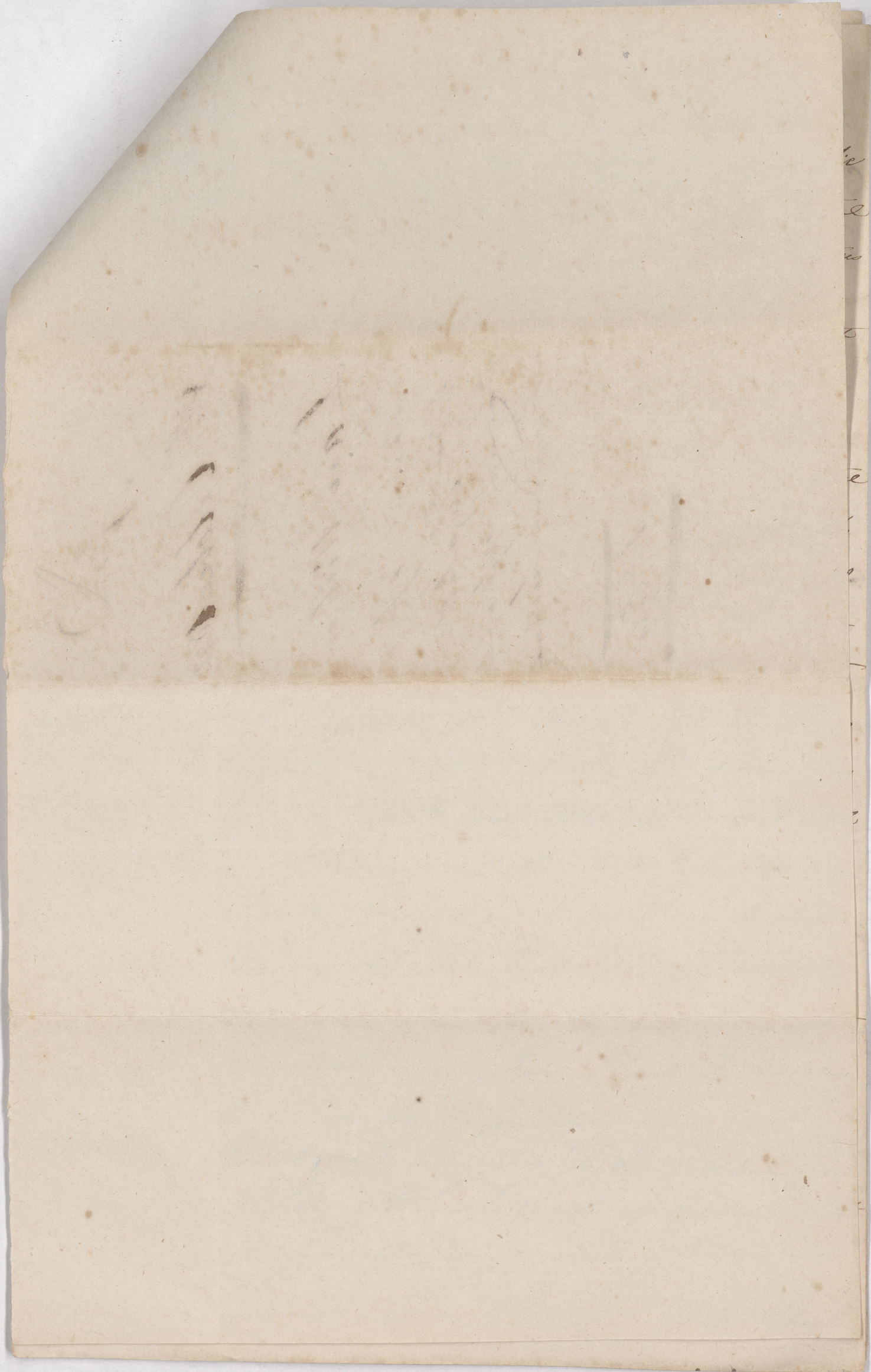
