Montreal 23rd Nov. 1801.

The Committee of the Magistrates appointed
to carry into effect the Resolutions of all the Magistracy
for establishing a Nightly Patrol report.

That the Patrol commenced on Thursday the
29th of October and has continued to be well attended
till of late, but having understood that it is
generally thought that there is not now great
necessity to continue it after Wednesday the
25th instant, and considering the expences which
are daily incurred, the Committee are of opinion
that the Patrol be then discontinued.

That it appears to the Committee that the
whole Expences incurred amount to forty five
pounds 3/4 of which they are of opinion that
£ 27.17.11 should be defrayed by subscription
as proposed in the 6th Resolution of the Magistracy
and that the residum being £ 17.5.5 should
be defrayed ^{by} moneys of the Police.






