Montreal 17 November 1792

I avail myself of this Opportunity by Mr Leath; and transmit you the West Acc<sup>t</sup>. for 1791 closed to 30<sup>th</sup> Instant, & continuation of Close of the NW Account for 1792 to the same date which by you will communicate to M<sup>r</sup> Small & Montour.

We have no mail from hence to go by the December packet, nor shall we draw on your house sooner than by the January one, when, at least, our Bills will amount to £2000.

We are just now informed that Mr McLeod has purchased Preux's House in the Recollect Street, if true, that circumstance may enclose our demands on you 1000 £.

Mr McBeath has pleaded, that you promised him we should advance him 1000 £ in the Course of the winter which he has nearly received, so that he has anticipated the credit he now receives by the NW<sup>t</sup> 1791. to the amount of 1200 £. After all if the advance should not be inconvenient on your side the water, I think you would do well to execute his order, as he seems determined to sport his property, your house may as well take the Commissions as another.

We have nothing to advise from the House to yours, by this opportunity except our Idea of the amount we may be obliged to draw for, which you will please to communicate with Compt<sup>s</sup> to Mr Fraser, to M<sup>r</sup> Small & Montour
