The Moose Deer

That I saw was a Female sent by Genl
Wentworth Gov^r of New Hampshire in May 1769
To the Marquis of Rockingham it was a year
of half old in height five feet 2 inches & a half
to the top of the bunch of its back. its upper lip
is divided like the Camels. The nostril is without upper lip.
it had five teeth on each side of the under jaw
& I think about 6 grinders I could not exactly
count them as they went to the extremity of the jaw
which I could not easily reach. They were all
even. its eyes were small its nose hooked as
in the Camel. its ears large. has a bunch on the
over the shoulder covered with long hair also a mane of the
same sort from top of the head to the bunch on the
back. a beard on the throat like some of the goat kind
a very short tail. its fore legs longer than the hinder
legs so that it is forced to kneel when it feeds on
the grass. it holds its neck stretched forward. its
winter coat is long & shaggy. which it changes in
July for a very smooth coat of a dark mouse colour.

with a chestnut coloured coat interspersed with white hairs. like some of our Roan horses but darker & not so red. The Beast was gentle. preferred the leaves & branches of Trees to grass or herbs it agrees in so many particulars with the shape of the Camel. that I suspect it to be the same with the Camelopardalis. but Linnaeus' description is too short to form a perfect judgment of it. this Beast came from New Hampshire the Camelopardalis is said to be a native of Ethiopia & Sennar. a Male was sent at the same time but died in its passage.

it is reported that some of these animals are nine feet high.

& the fossil horns which are dug up in bogs in Ireland are said to be the horns of this animal.

I have heard that a male is now living at the seat of the D: of Richmond.

of Deer.

The Many Writers of Natural History have left no subject more imperfectly treated on than this Genus of Quadrupeds. The very learned Linnaeus. describes 7 Species.

The Camelopardalis or Camelopard.

The Alces or Elk

The Elephas or Hog.

The Torandus which he speaks of a Synonymous Word with Rangifer. as described by C. G. Ray^{n. 8} & the Capra Greenlandica or Greenland Buck. described by Roe. quad. go c by Edwards v. t. 51. if it was not for so great an authority I should make no doubt. but that these were 3 distinct Animals. Linnaeus says the Torandus inhabits Europe Asia & America chiefly in the Northern Parts.

o The Diana or Fallow Deer. o The Guinean or Guinea Deer.

but I am very certain by the horns as well as
live beasts brought from America. that the Rain
Deer which is used in Lapland for carriage
& Draft is vastly different from any American
Deer. & that both in the Northern parts
of America & of Europe there are very
different species. Some having palms on the
tops of their horn & antlers on their ^{foreheads} horns
others both palms and branches or spikes
on the tops of the Horns & Antlers near
the forehead. & the Rain Deer Palms on the
summit & next the forehead & the place of the
antler. & this beast never changes its horn
as all others do & the female is horned.

The figure Edwards gives of the Greenland
Buck differs so vastly from all the fig^s I have
met with ^{of the Rain Deer} convinces me it can't be the same
animal. & yet it seems to me almost impossible
that so great a man as Linnaeus who lives at Stockholm
should be mistaken in this matter. he certainly
