Dear Dr. Adams:

I can make only a wild guess as to the present residence of Mrs. Adams and yourself, and to wonder what part of the earth you are visiting at the moment, but I write at a venture to Montreal partly to thank you for several catalogues and partly to report progress. We are having a perfectly wonderful summer here, remarkably cool, sunshiny weather, lots of new and old friends and I am able to do a little work at the California Institute of Technology with which I have been connected and where I have had a desk for the past six months.

We have met at dinner and elsewhere several of your geological friends, among them Dr. William M. Davis, Emeritus Professor of Geology at Harvard. He is as young and jolly as ever (act. 80) and still goes about the country with his rock hammer, giving lectures, etc. He was much interested in your book hunting schemes and asked to be remembered when I next wrote you.

In this connection you will, I am sure, be pleased to learn that I have ordered from Magge and hope to get the very rare Haarlem edition of Barthelomacus Anglicus DE PROPRIETATIBUS RERUM, printed by Jacob Bellaert, 1485. The Dutch title is BOECK VAN DEN PROPRIETEYTEN DER DINGHEN, Hain 2522. If it is not sold, I have acquired this rare item at a bargain. The woodcuts are mostly contemporaneously colored and the binding is of same date.

As you know, this early encyclopaedia has a chapter or two on mineralogy and was one of the first incumabula to take up extensively vertebrate Zoology.

The Olympic Games are just finished. The Canadians made a good showing and the whole affair was an outstanding success.

We went over to Hollywood last week to visit a famous Montrealer, my wife's niece, Norma Shearer, now among the film stars of the first magnitude. She gave us a "bang-up" luncheon, we were admitted to the "holy of holies," her studio, and saw her perform in a "set" now getting ready for the stage. We met and were introduced to several other constellations and altogether had a very good time.

I am sending off about a package a week of books given me (or that I bought) for the various McGill libraries - but you must see the Dutch Bartholomew if and when it arrives from Maggs in September.
