The systematic names are given in all instances, about one-third having been labelled with the vulgar equivalents in URDU.___ C.A.W.

Lady Guillim was the wife of Sir Henry Gwillim, a Justice of the Supreme Court of Madras, 1801-1807. She died in 1806, aged 44, and was 1807. buried in St. Mary's Church, Fort St. Georges, Madras.

So far as known, she was the first artist of importance to portray the larger birds lifesize, thus antedating Audubon by a generation. — C.A.W.
