

Clare August the 27<sup>th</sup> 1830

Dear Sir

A most happy mistake does procure me the honor of your correspondence: I am not the man whom you met last April at Annagethy Royal, though I certainly am the one whom your kind letter is directed to. I have received towards the end of July the case with the books. I had at the time the visit of Right Rev<sup>d</sup> D<sup>r</sup> Fraser. This hindered me to pay immediate attention to the books. — I am indeed very thankful to you for such kindness, and through you to the Society. You may be assured, the Books have been welcome. I beg the liberty to ask for Sixty more of the kind, as you tell me I can get more on the same terms. Our people are eager to have and read them, though some few of them had New Testaments, we could not procure them but at a great expense, I beg that the Society would be so kind, as to let me have a dozen of them, besides the Sixty mentioned above, for some poor families which stand in need of them. I have given but few of those

you had the goodness to send. I have had the pre-  
 caution to distribute them in all the different  
 quarters of our Settlement, that is nearly forty  
 miles long: some few per village. — Enough  
 the New Testament two were found ~~in~~ which  
 the end of St. Luke's, & the Beginning of St.  
 John's Gospel are wanting in French; and  
 instead there are about 24 pages which I believe  
 in Portuguese. These I shall dispose of in favour  
 of some poor School child, though through res-  
 pect we do not make use of the Scripture,  
 especially of the New T. as a School-Book.
