Dear W<sup>m</sup>

I hope this will find you in good health as  
this leaves me at present thank God I received  
your letter dated the 30 of November and glad to  
hear you was well by your letter I see you have  
left Mr. Mackenzie you did tell me nothing about  
your Farm what improvement you had made  
with your Oxen in a former letter you told me you  
was going to have a better school I mean a  
Grammar School in your next you will have the  
goodness to let me know all particulars about  
your self I have a wish to know as I am getting  
in year Twenty & four 21 March last a favour  
to your wish I have sent out for you to Prince  
Edward Island a small Box containing  
one Silver Hunting Watch two Coats both Blacks  
two pair of Shoes one Hat I have directed  
them to the care of Mr. Peak Prince Edward  
Island the comes out in one of Mr. Peaks Vessels  
of Stonehouse it is intended for her to sail  
the 1<sup>st</sup> of April for Prince Edward Island



When you receives this letter you will write  
to Mr. Peak at Prince Edwards Island to send  
you the box he will not send them until you write  
to Him as i requested him not in your next let  
me know what employment you have and all  
Particulars and a longer letter then the last  
very short one and write a more Plain hand  
you may be very glad of the Watch for i was very  
near done out of it by the Oliver in London i was  
never deceived so before in my life i was completely  
Bullied it was no better then a Probery to make the  
Best of it i suppose you have wrote to Miss Cook let  
me know in your next Poor James must have run  
through a Great deal of Property in what <sup>years</sup> i do not  
know more then you do Mr. Oliver told me he was seen  
with a handful of Bank notes in his hand not  
not accounted for <sup>before</sup> he was a Great sufferer  
before he was taken out of this world if i have  
a very <sup>a</sup> Goeable wife she sends her respects to you
