For The London Assurance
Company an insurance of £800
on the Ship Tobago, from
Pouey to Piquash back to the
United Kingdom & they have
received your Letter addressed
to Lloyd of the 7th May last
stating that from sundry reports
which had reached you respecting
the condemnation of the above
Vessel, it appeared doubtful

whether it was a proper or
legal transaction -

By the protest, which
has come forward - it appears
that in attempting to get into
Wallace she was driven by
the Ice on Fox Island and it
is stated in the Protest, made

at Amherst, that on Survey of
Joshua Huntis, Merchant
James B. Davison Ship Builder
James Hornington Ship Carpenter

that she was found on
a Reef of Rocks at the entrance
of Wallace Harbour, bilged with
her after Beams broken and it
was therefore adjudged that the
said Ship should be condemned.

By Annual Sales, found
Wallace seized by Mr George P.
Osley of Piquash. It appears

The Hull & Lower Masts sell for
£20 & the sails & other Stores
for £127.3.3 making a total of £147.3.3
From which is deducted Charges 48.7.5
or £ 98.5.10

and I shall be obliged to
you for such information
as you have records, respecting
the Condemnation of the
Vessel in question and
any other that may
be able to obtain, should
there appear to be
any thing improper in
the transaction -
