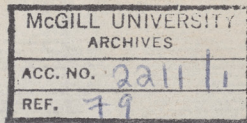


# Journal



Sunday  
24 May

left Pictou at 11 o'clock A.M., remained all day  
at the Entrance of the Harbour

Monday  
25 May

Wind at South, came up with Warrance at 6-  
o'clock P.M. - remained all night

Tuesday  
26 May

Wind at S.W. - came to anchor in Chedoke  
at 11 o'clock A.M. outside the Bar - hired a  
Huller and Rade to Captain Wharrie's 3 miles, saw  
the Goods his vessel sailed from the wreck of the  
Joseph, and took the Marks of some of the  
Packages - learned there a Mr Boate a Clerk  
of Wharrie's had been to see Mr Fairman and  
had got Orders to take such as were damaged  
and forward to Anishat such as were not  
prejudiced down and crossed the Harbour to see  
Mr Boate - found him examining another  
cargo of the Goods at Joseph Leblond's Store  
also examined them and found them  
chiefly dry but unpacked, took the  
marks of such as were not - protested  
against Mr Boate or any other person  
who would take these Goods unless they  
were taken to Anishat or Pictou there  
to be surveyed and sold under the  
eye of our agent, wrote also to Mr  
Fairman advising of this step, and re-  
questing him if they came to Anishat  
to order them on to Pictou - left also  
a Letter to Leblond and one to Boate



Stating that I held them in behalf of the  
Undersigners of said Goods responsible for  
the full value of them if they closed up  
my orders - Vouch promised in presence of  
Mr Malan not to take time to forward them  
to Amiskat

Wednesday  
27 May } Left Chediacamp at 5 AM - light wind at  
N E and calm all day - at 6 PM saw  
Entry Island Bearing North N E distant  
35 miles

Thursday  
28 May } Wind about west - light - at 12 noon calm  
at 6 PM light wind at N W, came to off  
Entry Island

Friday  
29 May } at 8 AM weighed anchor, wind at South  
stead in for Harbour Le Beau - at 2 PM  
came to anchor inside the Bar

Saturday  
30 May } went to Harbour Messing in a Boat, saw  
Mr Colbeck and stated my business - he gave  
me to understand that he was Lloyd's agent  
but could show me no evidentials - told  
me he had sold off all the goods in the  
Harbour but showed me no Bill Sales  
at Mr Minnerys Store he introduced me to  
his Tillows agent for Lloyd's

Sunday  
31 May } Went to Harbour Le Beau in Mr Colbeck's  
Boat

Monday  
1 June } Early in the morning went 3 miles out  
to see some property found at a Tur  
Station in Anticosti, examined it in  
company with Mr Colbeck and some



To Mr Colbeck that I had him amountable  
for the Property found at Anticosti with the  
amount called for it and settled the Claims for  
Salvage and Burial of the Dead Ladys

others and noted the Particulars in my Mem-  
Book - returned at 9 AM, Breakfasted at  
Mr Bedards the Priest - at 10 o'clock went  
in company with Mr Colbeck, Irving and  
Mr Donald and others to Benawa Bedwards  
Stone, Stated to him the object of my visit  
demanded the Property he had found from  
the wreck and offered to pay him Lawfull  
Salvage but was refused, required Mr  
Colbeck to interpose his Authority to  
compell Bedward, which he also refused  
and he and Irving both advised Bedward  
to resist my demand - Protested against  
all the parties and furnished a copy  
to Mr Colbeck - at which he went  
into a violent passion called me  
many ungentlemanly names and threaten-  
ed me with ~~with~~ Personal Violence  
wrote on Francis Lapear another of  
the Salvors who also refused to give  
up the property, Protested against  
him also

waiting for a Papsay to Birtan, observed on  
these and the previous days <sup>very</sup> people taking  
away part of the Goods to the Country  
I told same and told Mr Colbeck of  
others - Saw the Goods in Bedwards  
Stones - were chiefly clay - wrote by  
the Lady Birtan to Incheek to the  
Agent for Slaves informing them of



performing them of the state of the pro-  
perty here and at Chedecamp requested  
them to lay these accounts before the  
Cousigners and also Sir Jas Skipton  
went to Harbours Messing to look for  
a Passage

5<sup>th</sup> May  
page

returned to Harbours <sup>Leban</sup> in a Boat, and found  
Mr Collett Buisy taking off the Goods in  
Lapins Stone, found that the Salvors first  
took the half of the property first and  
Divided in Shares among the Crew and  
then sold the remainder, but a large part  
of the property was previously converted  
to their own use which myself saw

Saturday

6<sup>th</sup> May

Mr Collett had the remainder of Lapins goods  
and at same time, B Budwat & M Burke  
divided in two Shares the Goods saved by  
them in their respective respects, which they  
disposed of at their own discretion, the  
half among the Crew, and retained the  
other half - No person taking any account  
of their Proceedings - a deal of the property  
previously converted and sold, Tho' Patterson  
Purchaser - J Patterson, D. M. Donald  
A. Wallan, Andrew Doyle & Mr Townsend are  
Witnesses to this days Proceedings and many  
of the previous days Transactions

one Day previous saw some men  
dividing a quantity of Niggering which had not  
been sold - said to belong to a vessel - found  
Devil in the Jar which they plundered of
