Dear Sir, I have much pleasure in transmitting to you the accompanying resolutions - We are not a little obliged to yourself also for your part in befriending our Society - We will endeavour to obtain the reports as requested.

We did not like to pass any resolution on the latter part of your letter - We have ever been willing to let some who have seen our advantages glory over us - and to return good for evil.

I may inform you however that the principle contained in the last clause of the 4th Additional Regulations - adopted in 1827 has always been considered applicable to grants of every kind - and when proceeds are obtained it is expected as a matter of course that they come to the Society - It grieves us to hear that you also have divisions - Without doubt there is much good going on - for the enemy every where seems so peculiarly active -
