Extracts from Don Cameron's
Will - Lately of King's Coln, dated 15th
May 1840 -

After Preliminary in the usual
words as said down in Printed forms,

I give and bequeath to Flora my Wife
the Right, Title and full Claim of a comfortable
Maintenance, in food and Raiment as becoming
her Station, in Life, during her Natural Life time out
of the Real & Personal Estate to me belonging, or from
or out of the Annual Rent or proceeds thereof, which
said Estate consists at present in a Lot of Land
containing one Hundred & Twenty one Acres more or less

Also I give and bequeath unto the B-
& F Bible Society the sum of Twenty Pounds Sterling
to be paid out of my said Estate by my Hereafter
named Executors for the Benefit and Support of
the Glorious Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Lastly I give and bequeath to my Sister & Heir
at Law Janet Cameron of Stralings Shire Scotland,
her Heirs or legal Representatives, the whole of my
said, or the value or proceeds thereof, or such
part thereof as may be remaining after the
Deduction of my Wife, and satisfying all legal
Claims and Demands; and hereby constitute
make ~~and appoint~~ ^{appoint} Ordain Alex^r McVigie & Miss
John Cameron and Alex^r ~~Cameron~~ ^{McQuarrie} both of
Scots Hill, all in the County of Paton afore said
my Executors of this my last will and Tes-
tament, to attend to the Maintenance of my
Wife - the management of my Estate during her
Life time, and to be Buried in Decent Christian
Burial at their Discretion of my Executor -
The Disposal or Sale of the same after her Decease
to the best advantage, and the summittance
and the Remittance of the Proceeds or value
thereof when sold, to the said Janet Cam-
eron - her Heirs or legal Representatives.

And I do hereby totally disallow, revoke and
disannul all and every other Testament, Will, Legacy
Request and Executor, by me in any wise before
named, Witha, and bequeathed, Ratifying and con-
firming this and no other, to be my last Will
and Testament - in witness whereof I have here-
unto my name subscribed, and seal affixed this
15th day of May 1840.
