Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> August 1845

Dear Sir

I had a fine letter from Mr  
Loy on Saturday Reporting me to you  
and the fact which I had expected  
a fine copy since I would have been  
so sure but was anxious to have that Mr  
Gould had fixed the boundaries so that  
there will be no misapprehension hereafter  
and I am still exceedingly anxious that  
Mr Loy will be perfectly satisfied on that  
point before its delivery. I will be satisfied  
with any security that you may take from  
Mr Loy. I have always found him honest  
and true and think that his note is all that is  
required here of interest until the 1<sup>st</sup> of May  
1846. then to be paid of Payment. I wanted you  
some time since acknowledging the receipt of  
a communication offering me interest for the  
money until wanted this is all right and  
should I want it I will let you know



In your time I Stated to Mr. Lox when  
he was that Mr. Justice had seen the complete  
who was satisfied that the Boundary should  
be fixed between him and me so as to give  
Mr. Lox 2 1/2 Rods and Mr. Justice said he  
would be in Peter Shurly and would so  
fix it and I will thank you to say to  
Mr. Lox that I only wanted to hear that  
this was done before returning the deed.

Had a few lines from your  
Brother to say he had paid you over some  
money for me for the amount of his debt about  
which I think there must be some slight  
mistake. I found out his debt from which  
it will appear that I owed him at that time  
16/2. That from him some 15 pence 1/2  
which could be more than 10/10. I will  
thank you at your convenience to say so to  
him.
