Dear Sir

I have to thank you for your kind attention in sending over my Bibles so soon. The people on board the steamer were careless in covering them when the snow came on, or I should have got them in excellent order.

I find we can get 16 pages of the Harmonicon on the Press, but the Pressman charges 3^d a token more to work it, as it is heavier but we shall nevertheless be able to do it all for £15..15..0 you paying the freight over and Back. The best way would be to send the paper from Boston direct to us. We have a Vessel leaving Boston the first week in June. This is if you give us the job. I send you an Extra paper printed last week with a list of duties which maybe useful to you. About the Millboard as I have not a stock on hand you may order it at the same time as the paper, provided it cost no more than 3 Cents^{the} the price I pay for it. at Grant Daniels & Co.

The Hand book of Nova Scotia could be done up for 2/0 pr 100 like ^{the copy sent} if you found the cover

but to be glued on the bench and wastepapered
and stiffer cover they would be 3/4. 100. they
would however look much better,
