Halifax July 26 - 1856

Messrs. J. Dawson & Son -
Picton -

Dear Sirs,

On to-day we were
favoured with yours of the 24th.
The paper for Mr. Sutherland is mailed
as instructed - The first No. for current
year - We shall attend to your
directions respecting the "Illustrated
Times". If you contrived to import
Capell's papers &c. so that the drawback
nearly covered expenses of importations
it is more than we can manage -
Unless we get a case of books at same
time as Capell's are sent, the expenses
swallow the entire profit - The
steamer previous to last it happened
there was nothing else to be sent

from London but the fortnightly
supply of Capell's paper -

The expenses on the parcel am-
ounted to $3\frac{3}{6}$ Stg or about
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ ^d - on every copy of the paper.

It is only the opportunity of having
Capell's enclosed with other goods
that enables us to avoid loss in the

business. We are making an effort
to have our parcels carried on more
reasonable terms - if we succeed,

you will be advised of the fact
