Messrs James Dawson & Sons.

Gentlemen.

I have just received your Note of the 14th inst. with copy of Books, charged the 16th July last amty to £1.4.0 — I ordered the Books but strange to say they never as yet came to hand, when Dr. Kerr went to Picton in Sept^r he was kind enough to say he would make inquiry respecting them and if sent would settle the amt. but having learned that you forwarded to Rev Mr Murray, Bullock & Gearman & Reader for me. he paid the amt of those two Books to either yourself or a Young Woman in your Store, but did not get a receipt.
