more money if

would sell. The

offer does not say
whether the wharf

could add say
\$500 more, and
include the water lot.

The payment might
be put still later
than the last instalment,

with interest. I should
think also it will
not be unpay for
you & remain so long

as 3 months after
the transfer. You

should have little to
do, and it might be

ways.
