Yatuceengook - Letter
10th July 1857

Wm Campbell

Sir

I show you few of my
and feel satisfied to find that
you have left over small claims
in the hands of Messrs Proctor
I do not think they will have
much trouble with me I shall
anxious to have it discharged
Have not 2 of my possession of ^{part} ~~part~~
There is one way in which I can
pay it I have a small sum
allowed me as Controller of
Customs which I can draw
until the end of the year if
the debt is not paid before that
time I ^{will} reserve for that purpose
I think when you carried on so
large dealings in former years
and the large success I have
made and what I am now ac-
tually suffering on that account
you

will be disposed to take £15-⁰⁰-⁰⁰
In full, In all my own debts I
have not been able to get either
prompt or Interest - after many
years of hard labour and the
holding of a large amount of prop-
erty I have now to labour with
my hands for a bare living.

As you are about
to leave for ^{an} new home It is not
likely I will ever ^{see} you again I wish
you a happy meeting with your
country son and all the happiness
you may there enjoy - If ^{it} ever pro-
-vide I would be glad to live the
place where I ^{have} met much ~~of~~ ^{of} you
at many dissensions - It is not my
fortune to go, as you do.
