Calif. Nov 18 1858 -

James Dawson Esq.
Dear Sir.

We beg to enclose two
Boxes to you. With regard to the freight
on your parcel we cannot see how we can
charge the amt to Mr Pherson, as the Maps
were ordered from you and you failed to
fulfil the contract with Mr Hamilton. consequently
the maps must still be your property. Mr
Hamilton says that had he met with
any loss he should have looked to you
for redress as you agreed to furnish him
with a quantity of maps by a certain time
but did not keep your engagement.
Mr Pherson will not pay us. in fact
we do not know them in the transaction.
if you can arrange with them for the
amt we shall be glad. but we must
charge the amt to you, we are rather
astonished, after paying the freight of
the parcel, which was merely to oblige
you, that there should be so much
said about it we think you are
in duty bound to refund us
whoever you

may think liable, we shall forward the
amt as per ^{of} enclosed (less the freight on
the parcels) viz £4.13.3. to Mr Pymrod.
