My dear Sir

I have the receipt of a letter from
Mr. Mc Gregor to Mr. Bagnall which was forwarded
to me as there has been no communication from the firm
of Messrs. Bagnall about the lot referred to in your

Mr. Bagnall's letter informs me that he refers to the
lot of goods which you have sent him for a

My dear Sir

Since the receipt of a letter from Rev. Mr McGregor to Mr Bayne which was forwarded to you there has been no communication from the heirs of Reid deceased about the lots of land on New John Road. Mr Bayne informs me that he replied to Mr McGregor giving him full explanations of the whole matter from a memorandum I gave him I note also as you are aware in reply to a letter received by you from a Mr Robertson of Perth in September 1854, but there has been no reply to either. This summer I was called on to pay the taxes, and this of course will be repeated every year I do not see any propriety in allowing this matter to remain longer unsettled with you a/c unpaid and a small one of my own. I have received two offers this year for the lot on the south side of the road of £30 to £35. The wood is fast disappearing from this lot and it is impossible for me to check it. I believe if offered at auction this lot would sell readily and very likely the other also though it is of much less value.
