The Volume will consist of a Memoir embracing all of his Autobiography that has been preserved, with a large number of facts and incidents, collected with much labor from various sources, not only illustrating his character and labor, but also exhibiting the state of Nova Scotia in its early settlement; and also a few of his Remains, consisting of Letters, Pamphlet on Slavery, Essays on the Millennium, &c.

By the advice of friends, the author has added a larger amount of information regarding the early Social and Ecclesiastical history of the LOWER PROVINCES; than he had at first contemplated. This will increase the size of the volume to about 500 pages, and will render necessary a small increase of price on what he had first intended. The price now will be 5s. to subscribers and 6s. 6d. to non-subscribers.
