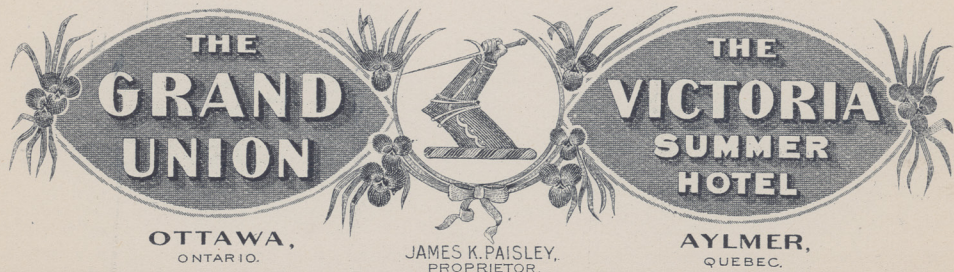


Nov 2<sup>nd</sup> - 1911

 Abe married Mary Cotton of

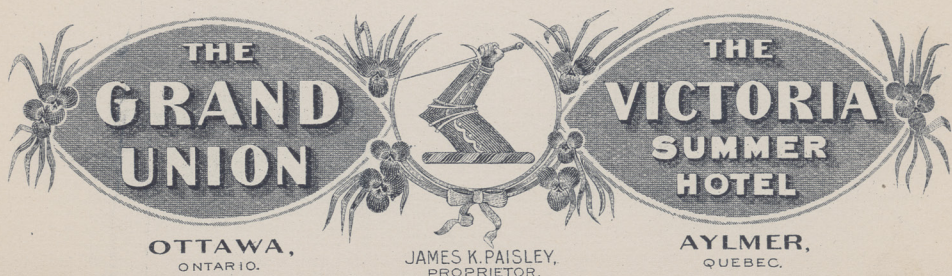


Ottawa and has three little girls — Archie has just been married a short time to Miss Madge (Fontain?) Brown whose father was in the C.P.R.
