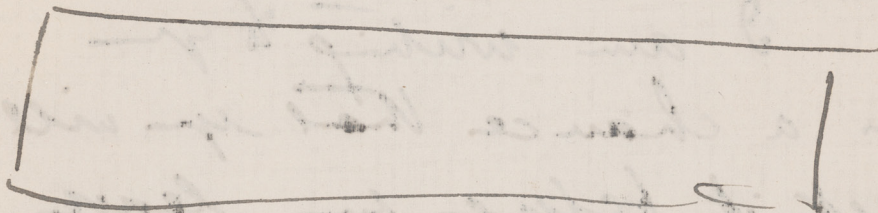
Thursday.

piece of Indian embroidery



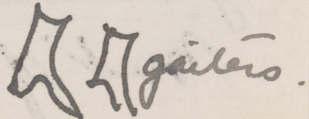
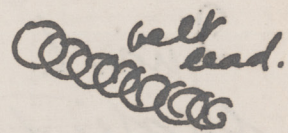
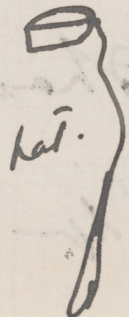
