Halifax Aug 15th 1849

My Dear Sir

I received from you the liquid account when I was in Boston, but the expenditure has been chiefly since that time. I will therefore require something additional in the account which I have in my possession. I have the receipts down to East River by Rev Mr Roy L. 3. If any was received after that please to report it and let me show all the items of expenditure after June 30th Messinger funds N. G. 37 1/2.

I will expect the desired information as soon as possible as the minutes are in the printers hands and the accounts are now the only cause of delay.

I have the prompts on which I want information from your father but I think I can obtain it from you without writing a separate letter. Inquire if he furnishes Mr M. Colbeck with a statement of the accounts of the Domestic Mission Board. If he does then it may be on the way but I have not yet received it. All I want is the
