

Prms Oct. 19. 1845.

My Dear Sir

Your fav. of 11th instants was lying
in the post office here at the time I last ad-
dressed you, and I got it soon after mine was
sent off, and I quite forgot in the proper time
to acknowledge the receipt of it. You will please
pardon me. The twenty-one pounds & 24. - came
enclosed. The account all right.

I quite approve of the decision you have made
of the return of reports. It is quite right that
our Board should pay the larger sum -
