

Runce Down Hoagly April 29th 1850

Dear Sir,

My son William will hand
you a bag with the following sums
£2.15.0 from Casempique for the
Mission board: and £1.2.6 from the
children in this congregation for the same
which has been received in addition to
what has been sent before. This is as counted
in P. E. Island currency. Notice it in the
Chronicle or Register as received from
the places mentioned, and it will
be sufficient.

There is a balance I see in your books
against me of 19/- in Halifax currency
which you will also receive and credit.
I am not very certain about the value
of some of the pieces, but be so good as
give the children in both places mentioned
credit to the full amount mentioned
for the boat, and if there be more or less
let it stand with yourself, and I will
settle when I come to the Island.

Be so good as let William have what
Stationery he may want, or if necessary
some books, and place to my acct.
