Dear Dawson


I sent you a small paragraph which I put into the Travellers to correct the blundering report of that paper of my Lecture. You see we have now 3 individuals & 2 species of reptile bone land shell.

My first guess was *Classitria*, as Dr. Gould has made the very important observation that the shell is reversed like *Classitria Cylindrella* & some other land shells & a character so rare & exceptional in marine shells I return to my first idea.  The whorls are striated much finer than is to be above, while as nearly 3 times magnified, some of the middle ones are larger than upper ones. A careful drawing having been made by Dr. Gould we are going to venture on a trial to carve out the mouth as we think the whole shell is there. Dr. Wyman found it when searching for bones & asked me if it was a coprolite or a pupa? The specimen was one of those containing much charcoal & like 100° which I threw away.

I wish much we had not left anything behind us. Wyman says it is well worth while for his osteological purposes to obtain the rest if you can. The two staped bones } are so unequal in size as to belong to two } individuals, certainly of the same species. There is also an ischium & tibia (or fibula;) The jaw is too imperfect to tell much. The teeth too brittle to show structure.

I am much obliged to you for your paper on Education which is excellent. Your time is I doubt not too busily employed professionally to allow you to give much to the old tree, but I shall tell Wyman that I pay any expenses of specimens you may send to him for our paper, &
