Dear Sir,

Several weeks ago I sent you a description of a cast of a reptile jaw which I found between Joggins in Minas + McCurns river in a large fragment of stone which had fallen from the bank. The bone is six inches in length and appears to have been the half of the upper jaw of something I don't know what, and contains thirteen conical teeth in a space of about four inches in length. These teeth were from $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{8}$ of an inch in length. Thinking that every discovery of this kind, ^{however small} ought not to be lost sight of I wrote you quite a full description of it and forwarded to your address hoping to get a line from you in reply but as several weeks have elapsed + I have not heard from you I write again thinking it possible that my last may have miscarried, for I think that you are much interested in the Fossils of N.S. to reply to my communication.
