sandstones of Sir  
W. Logan, believed

flytes & Protoceras  
and also with Singus,  
Mastodons and New-  
Dellaria. I propose

I have got the  
fruit of my new species  
of *Psilophyton* most curious  
specimens unlike any-  
thing modern; but are  
proving to those of  
*Insectaria* more than  
to those of *Psiloptera*.
