My dear Sir,

I'm sorry to say
20 shares of your City
Stock are yet unsold -
so difficult is it to
find buyers - I sh^d
gt for 5 shares -
The sales have been
of small lots of 5
& 10 - and while there
are a dozen persons
probably wanting to sell
of anything over 10
can be realized, it
is hard for any one
to do much.

I do hope to close
them tomorrow

We today sold Dominion
6% North at $106\frac{1}{2}$ —
clear to the buyer —
which is the market
price. City North

paying 7% is $112\frac{1}{2}$.

But the difference in
value by calculation
is nearly 10% — so

that City would be
the cheaper purchase
the preference for the
Dominion North & the
forced purchaser of it
for deposits with Govt
do not keep it higher
for the reasons.

You state you prefer
not to be taxed up the
higher price of my
document, but
kindly say which
we shall take
for you.
