My dear Sir,

Your note of the 26th ult. reached me a few days ago, and with a view to obtaining the information you desire I at once wrote to Mr. Paisley. I have not yet received his answer, but will write again as soon as it arrives.

I write now these few lines to say that I am about to send on to the office of the Survey, together with some rock specimens for Dr. Hunt a number of carboniferous plants, partly from Grand Lake and Bathurst, but mostly from a new locality at 3 Tree Creek near Hart's Mills, in Sunbury County. These belong to the collections of the University, but I am anxious to have them accurately determined, and thinking that such determination may advance the interests of the survey I have

sent them on, requesting Dr. Hunt to place them in your hands, provided you have leisure to look them over, and to return them, with the determinations, when convenient. Some of them I can easily recognize but as the list may be quoted in the Report of the Survey, I ~~was~~ anxious to ensure perfect accuracy. I want them also as a representative collection for our Museum.

You are no doubt aware of the progress of our Survey. It is apparently changing much that we had supposed fixed and settled, but at the same time throwing much new light on this wonderfully complicated district.

I am glad to learn that your explorations at Gaspe have proved so successful.
